Dan Gordon is known in the Jewish tradition as a *maggid* (one who shares sacred stories). He uses storytelling to teach and inspire, adapting traditional folk tales and creating new stories based on his personal experiences. He has toured as a performer and workshop leader throughout the United States, Israel and Australia. He is a regular presenter at the annual Conference for Alternatives in Jewish Education, and has been asked to co-chair the National Jewish Storytelling Network beginning in 2006.

Dan became the rabbinic spiritual leader of Temple Beth Torah in Humble, Texas in 1998, where he blends storytelling with Torah study to help understand how the lessons of the past can guide us into the future.
